

## Course Descriptions

### LG 202 Greek 1 (parts 1 & 2)

Instructor: Mike Kennedy

Every Bible teacher should have a basic understanding of Koine Greek. First year Greek will give students a working knowledge of the grammar and the vocabulary of the New Testament. This course is a prerequisite for Advanced Greek, where you will actually translate parts of the Bible.

### NT 201 1 Corinthians

Instructor: Justin Brink

This class will help students understand some of the complex problems that take place in church leadership. 1 Corinthians teaches us about many important doctrines like the Lord's Supper and the resurrection but it also gives us practical principles about unity and love in the church.

### NT 102 Life of Christ (parts 1 & 2)

Instructor: Joel Adams

Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John are the inspired accounts of the life of Christ. This class is an examination of the events and teachings of Jesus recorded in these important books.

### TH 201 Hermeneutics

Instructor: Mike Kennedy

This one-semester course provides the skills necessary for interpreting the Bible. It teaches the principles that lie behind the Science of Interpretation. These principles must be applied to any document for proper understanding.

### NT 301 1 & 2 Timothy & Titus

Instructor: Dave Brink

This is a one-semester course ideal for those who are preparing for leadership or ministry in the church. The study of the "Pastoral Epistles" includes the qualifications for elders, gender issues, principles of church leadership, and other important doctrines.

### NT 203 2 Corinthians & Galatians

Instructor: Justin Brink

In these two letters, students will experience the passion Paul had for the discipleship of the people he led to Christ. 2 Corinthians addresses: the meaning of repentance, life after death, and God's blessing in giving. The Galatian epistle teaches us about the Gospel of grace and the fruit of the Spirit.

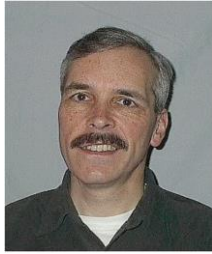

## Accreditation and Degrees

Northwest College of the Bible is not accredited by an accrediting association. However, NCB is certified by the state of Oregon to offer degrees in ministry, sacred literature, and theology. We have been successfully preparing men and women for service in God's Kingdom since 1952. Our high academic standards are comparable to other Bible colleges. Most secular colleges and universities will accept our credits for continuing education. Many of today's godly and successful preachers have come from this school. The teachers at NCB hold academic degrees in ministry, missions, sacred literature and theology. All of the teachers are active leaders or ministers in local Christian Churches or Churches of Christ. And most importantly, all the teachers at NCB have a genuine relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ, they are people of prayer, and they are uncompromising in their conviction that the Bible is the inspired, inerrant, and authoritative word of God.

## Tuition

The cost to attend NCB is much lower than most Bible colleges. Our professors are ministers and elders from local congregations. They donate their ministry time to teach in the Bible college. Students must place their fellowship with one of the supporting churches. Students are expected to be active in the work of their congregation, tithe, and maintain at least a C grade average. Tuition is \$15 for each four-credit hour class. Students can audit classes free of charge.
